**MASTER CLASSES**

Students who wish to play in a recital may be assigned a practice time with their accompanist outside of the day camp schedule. The title of the recital piece must be included with this Application. If it is not, a place in a recital will not be reserved and parents will not be called to verify the piece. Please discuss this with your teacher early, so your child won't miss the opportunity to play. An accompanist\* will be provided free of charge. Your student will be notified at time of registration regarding day of recital.
